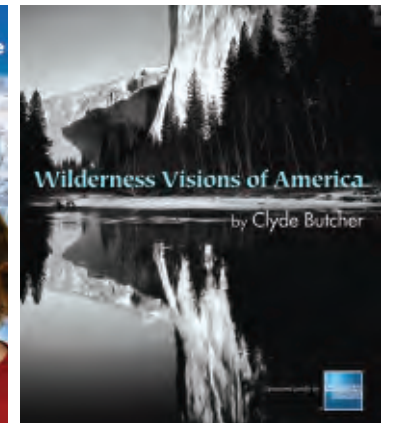
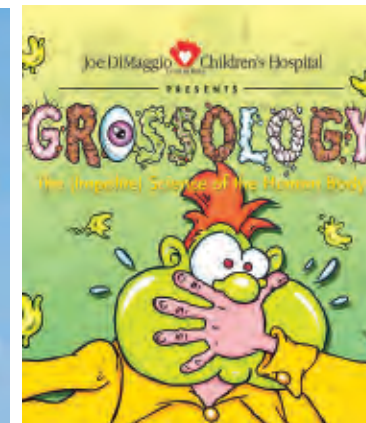

- 83,828 students, teachers and groups made visits to the Museum.
- 7,759 students attended Museum labs and demonstrations designed to augment classroom curriculum and complement our films and exhibits.
- 657 children attended the Museum's camp programs.
- 16,440 students were served by the Museum-on-Wheels school and youth outreach program, a 17% increase over prior year.
- Sea Turtle Walks sold out with 632 participants.
- 1,529 youth enjoyed a night at the Museum in the Museum's overnight camp-in program. Camp-in revenue increased by 24%.
- 2,611 children and parents attended birthday parties at the Museum.
- Museum's education staff trained 65 Broward County teachers in science curriculum development, hands-on activities and teaching techniques in areas of early childhood education, physical and biological science.
- 630 live science demonstrations were served at the Science Café.
- 550 table talks and informal presentations were served at various locations throughout the Museum.
- Thanks to the Jerry Taylor & Nancy Bryant Fund, four young adults were served by a paid internship and mentoring program for youth transitioning out of the foster care system.
- Staff and volunteers delivered 1,250 Animal Encounter programs to Museum visitors.
